# INSTRUCTIONS FOR THIS CORE COMPETENCY DRILL Preventative Maintenance for Emergency Response Vehicles

A vehicle that has not been properly maintained can result in a delayed response to scene, MVAs, and even death. Drivers can be held personally liable for any incidents that occur while operating a department vehicle. The AHJ is responsible to create and set the standard for preventative maintenance.

### **IDENTIFY**

- Identify and review the SOG for Preventative Maintenance.
- 2. Identify SOG for taking apparatus out of service.
- Identify what things on duty crews should be responsible for fixing.
- 4. Identify when things need to be passed to maintenance.

## MAINTAIN

- 1. Check and maintain all fluid levels
- 2. Check and maintain all lights
- 3. Check and maintain hoses
- 4. Check and clean battery terminals

#### REPORT

- Weekly In depth truck checks are the days that all minor items should be identified.
- 2. When items are not caught or ignored it reflects poorly on you and your crew.
- Ignored or missed items can result in delays or failure to respond to emergency calls.
- Preventative Maintenance is a tool used to ensure trucks are well maintained and remain in functioning order.
