DESCRIPTION AND EXPECTED PERFORMANCE: Each member of PRFD shall demonstrate the ability to assess and utilize the RIT PAK on a down firefighter in a stress-filled environment. Practice RIT Deployment.

Length: 2 HOURS

REFERENCE: PRFD S.O.G.s for RIT activation,
RIT pack operations, and calling the Mayday.
Review NFPA standards 1001, and NFPA
1407: Standard for Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews.

Equipment, Props, Information or Other Resources Needed: RIT Pak, Full PPE & SCBA, Radio or speaker to create a loud stressful environment.

If you don't know all of these answers then you need to practice!

In an open area with safety in mind, conduct your drill:

- Generate a RIT scenario and a simulated downed firefighter for a Mayday drill.
- Utilize full PPE and SCBA without damaging gear or anything in your surrounding.
- Practice the Mayday procedure. UCAN or Who, Where, and What do you need will work just fine.
- Practice terminology, accountability, communications, and especially your RIT connection skills in a darked down
 or no visibility environment.
- Perfect practice....Makes perfect.
